

ABOUT JACKSONS LANE

Jacksons Lane has been a creative and cultural hub for the community for 35 years. We are housed in an imaginatively converted Grade 11 Listed Edwardian church in Highgate, revenue funded by the London Borough of Haringey and are delighted to be a revenue funded client of Arts Council England London and to have been included in their new National Portfolio of funded organisations. A major community-focussed programme of work is due to begin in April 2012 and has been funded on a five-year basis through Big Lottery Reaching Communities. We receive project funding from a variety of sources, including John Lyon's Charity, Garfield Weston Foundation, A B Charitable Trust, Ernest Cook Trust, Steel Charitable Trust, Hornsey Parochial Charities, Lady Gould's Charity and Tottenham Grammar School Foundation.

Jacksons Lane benefits from a 160 seat theatre, an 80 capacity dance studio space, a stunning 100ft long sprung-floored rehearsal studio, three activity rooms and a bright foyer space also housing a Mediterranean café and bar.

On top of our year-round programme of the best in contemporary theatre, dance and circus Jacksons Lane offers a wide range (currently 40 per week) of arts based courses, classes and activities for the local and regional community. Recent companies we have worked with include: Foursight Theatre, RedCape, Maison Foo, Little Angel, Sugar Beast Circus, Unlimited Theatre, Little Bulb, Stephen Merchant, Michael McIntyre, Action Hero, Wendy Houston, Tall Stories and Stuff & Nonsense. Our Associate Artists are: So & So Circus, Square Peg and Collectif and then... (funded through the Jerwood Charitable Trust, in partnership with Jacksons Lane, The Roundhouse and Circus Space). We are proud to be a partner in CircusFest, Suspense Festival, and London International Mime Festival.

This is an exciting time for Jacksons Lane, as we enter the Arts Council's new National Portfolio, continue to increase and develop our audiences and work in partnership with Big Lottery to deliver an expanded arts-based participation, education and outreach programme. We are also working towards an ambitious and exciting £4.2m capital project to develop, green and modernise our building making all of our spaces high spec and making the organisation both environmentally and financially sustainable.
